



THE MOVING SCULPTURE PROJECT

2010

Thanks to generous support from the Ian Potter Foundation, Cairns Regional Gallery will be offering primary and secondary schools of the region an innovative and exciting outreach exhibition of sculptures from seven local artists during 2010. The Moving Sculpture Project aims to continue to foster the Gallery's outreach education program, after the outstanding success of the Transience Travelling Schools Exhibition in 2008. Seven prominent and emerging local artists will create sculptures that can be packaged in portable crates and travel to local schools to be easily set up, displayed and studied. The artists selected for the project are: Kylie Burke, Susan Doherty, Terry Eager, Ken Thaiday Snr, Ben Trupperbäumer, Jennifer Valmadre and Daniel Wallwork. Each artist works in differing mediums and the sculpture themes all have relevance to the Tropical North Queensland region. The sculptures will move in custom-made crates that when unpacked can double as display plinths. An education kit and DVD will accompany the exhibition. The sculptures will be a part of the Cairns Regional Gallery Collection, enabling them to be used indefinitely as an education resource for schools. All costs for the first year of the project have been covered by the Ian Potter Foundation and Cairns Regional Gallery. Nine schools taking advantage of this innovative exhibition during the period May – Nov 2010 are: Redlynch State College, Peace Lutheran College, Kuranda District State College, Gordonvale State High School, Woree State High School, Good Counsel College Innisfail, Edge Hill State School, St Andrews Catholic College and Mount St Bernard College Herberton.
