READING THE LANDSCAPE PHOTOGRAPHY WORKSHOP WITH KERRY TRAPNELL

Saturday 20 February (8 – 11am reconvene 1 – 4pm)

Renowned local photographer and exhibiting artist Kerry Trapnell will facilitate a practical workshop for people interested in landscape photography. An early start morning field trip will take participants to interesting local landscapes where Kerry will demonstrate effective composition for photography. Participants will reconvene at the Gallery in the afternoon where images taken in the morning will be studied and discussed. Participants will need to provide their own transport, lunch and camera (digital preferred with downloading connections or cards). This workshop is suitable for beginners or those who would like to further their photography skills.

PORTRAITS ENLIGHTENED PHOTOGRAPHY WORKSHOP WITH ROB HARRIS

Saturday 20 March and Sunday 21 March, 1-4pm each day

Inspired by the *Max Dupain - on Assignment* exhibition, local portrait photographer and member of the Cairns Photographic Society Rob Harris will enlighten participants with his knowledge of utilising light and shadow to compose high quality portraits. Rob will use the services of a live model and participants will use the natural light and dark shadows in the Gallery to create different portraiture effects.

Participants will need to bring their own digital camera and memory cards to download to a computer. This workshop is suitable for beginners or those who would like to learn new photography skills.
